The Wetlands Conservancy is leaping into 2015 with our new salamander and frog breeding monitoring program! We need your help to officially monitor our wetland preserves for amphibians for the very first time!

Who: Dedicated citizens over the age of 12

What:

- Attend a classroom amphibian training
- Survey a wetland 3 different times
- Collect data
- Install bamboo stakes

When:

January 24, 2015: You choose one of the two classes to attend:

9:30-11:30am on Jan. 24th at 600 NE Grand Ave, Portland, OR

10:00am-12:00pm on Jan 24th at 21410 SE Highway 224, Damascus, OR

Between February and April: Survey your wetland three (3) times



Why:

- To discover where common and rare amphibian species are breeding
- Data will assist in creating restoration plans and assessing the success of restoration activities
- Enjoy the beauty of a wetland
- Put a wildlife survey on your resume
- Improve wildlife habitat in your area

Where: One of four select wetland preserves in the Portland area!

- Waders (although you are welcome and encouraged to use your own)
- Survey materials including egg mass identification sheets, map, data sheets, and bamboo poles
