Basic Overview

Future Leaders in Action is dedicated to cultivating leadership and supporting youth through our fellowship program. Fellows, college students and recent college graduates, work on-site, full-time at a partner community organization to implement and evaluate a recurring program that supports children and youth in one of the following areas:

- Advancing Skills for Success
- Promoting Public Health
- Promoting Social Welfare and Serving the Disadvantaged
- Protecting the Environment

Throughout the fellowship, fellows are responsible for fundraising at least \$500 for Future Leaders in Action. Fellows have explicit objectives and work with the partner organization and FLIA in implementing and evaluating a program that helps children. Fellows must submit an evaluation and report of their work upon completion. The result is professional and leadership development in a fast-paced learning environment. Responsibilities

The fellow will work closely with the Boys and Girls Clubs of Portland to review and implement the Healthy Lifestyles program. The fellow will research youth fitness measures, and working with program staff determine which measures are feasible in a Club environment. The fellow will then develop a framework for implementation and distribution of resources. Upon review of the spring Healthy Lifestyles program, the fellow will develop a summer version of the program and oversee its launch and execution over the summer. Finally, the fellow will provide a report and suggestions for the 2016-17 Healthy Lifestyles program. The fellow will help determine the best date for the fall ZooSnooze and arrange the initial registration. The fellow will check-in daily with FLIA to ensure the programs run accordingly. The fellow will attend a weekend retreat with other FLIA fellows.
